Carla & Ramona DelaRosa are sisters, young women who, between the two of them, have four children. Both women were diagnosed with thyroid cancer, as was their other sister, and they have had to undergo radiation therapy treatment. They are both continuing to work, but they are struggling to keep up with the extra bills. We gave them Walmart gift cards to help cover food and basic household expenses.

Sandy Brocamontes is a mother of three girls, who has fallen behind on bills, due to a shortage of hours at her job. She was recently forced to move to a different apartment, due to a bed bug infestation, which also means replacing furniture and other household items. We wrote a check to the complex, to help her catch up on rent, and free up some funds to purchase needed items.

Jazmyn Griego is a young lady who just finished 6th grade with a 4.0 grade point average. She plays for the Albuquerque

Annette Griego is the hard-working mother of our young softball star, but she has been struggling to come up with the funds to cover the trip, as well as to cover the cost of deductible on her car, which was recently wrecked. These added costs have put a heavy burden on her already tight finances, and she has fallen behind on a few of her bills. We gave her a Walmart gift card to help cover household needs, and free up some income to catch up on bills.

Erich Von Schuetze is an elderly gentleman who was diagnosed with stage 4 lung cancer just a few months ago. He and his wife live on a subsistence-level income, and they are struggling to keep up with the bills. Pat, his wife, works part time, but has had to miss work to help provide care for her husband.
