Elizabeth Sheridan is the mother of 5-year-old Kaitlyn, who was diagnosed with a tumor at the base of her brain. Tragically, the cancer is aggressive and does not usually have a good outcome. The child has been going through radiation therapy, which was very painful and sadly not very effective. Elizabeth took a leave of absence from her job to care for her child, but she is still responsible for her insurance payments. She is now trying to sell her house to get some equity to keep up with all the bills. We wrote a check to her mortgage company to help keep afloat during this agonizing time.

Tiffany Sanchez is the single mother of two teenage boys, who attend Valley High School. She works full time, but she is barely able to make ends meet and has had a difficult time finding a better job. Both of her boys are active athletes, playing football, basketball and baseball. As expected, the fees from each sport put a heavy strain on her finances, and even with fundraising, it is difficult to cover all the costs of participating in sports. We wrote a check to the VHS Boosters, to help with yearly dues for both boys to continue in sports. Keep up the hard work and the good example, Tiffany.

Angela Sandoval was the caretaker for her sister, Dolores, until she passed away this May. She had moved in to help with her care, several months prior, and during that time, her niece, who was very ill, moved in. Angela's own family has been struggling: her husband had a hip replacement surgery, also in May, and has been unable to work. In addition, she is helping her son, who attends UNM, with rent. Angela cannot afford to cover her niece's rent, and so she must break the lease she co-signed for her sister. We wrote a check to help her cover the lease termination fee.
