Jaime has volunteered for the high school youth soccer camp for the last 3 years, and he and his team have been actively involved in the community, including feeding the homeless and a cancer awareness project. We gave him a \$500 scholarship to help with tuition.

## General Assistance Given



Brenda Perry, obo Desert Hills. Desert Hills is a 24-hr residential treatment facility for at-risk youth, with many suffering mental illness from sexual and/or physical abuse. Many of these have little or no family support, dependencies, and live there 9 months or more a year. The program is on a strictly limited budget, and the directors are therefore limited to what activities and items can be purchased. Brenda, the Program Director of the Redwood unit of Desert Hills, asked for help to purchase hygiene and personal supply items. We gave Brenda \$299.00 for the youth.

<u>Alisa Gonzales</u> Alisa is a single mother, with a daughter who has CDLS and heart problems. She needs assistance with thickener for her daughter's formula, help with utility bill and any financial assistance available. We gave her \$250



<u>Derrick & Monica Otero</u> The Oteros are a family of 6, the youngest of which has a blood disorder. They are unsure how they will pay for medical bills they, from treatments, to medications, to possible bone marrow treatments; they will be making a trip to Denver Children's Hospital. There live with Derrick's parents, which covers rent and some needs We gave \$200 for

<u>Socorro Saldivar</u> Socorro is a mother of six, who is doing her best to make ends meet. She often doesn't have enough income to provide for the kids' basic needs, such as toiletries, food and clothes, much less buying them the toys and games that most kids are privileged to enjoy. She asked for any help that we can give. We gave her \$200.00 to help with general expenses.





<u>Kimberly Hernandez</u> Kimberly is a single mother of 4, with chronic kidney disease that has progressed to end stage renal disease. She has 14% function remaining and is currently on the national list for kidney transplant. She needs help with utilities, as soon as possible. We gave her \$299.

<u>Other Recipients</u> <u>Cecilia Munoz</u>—Soccer coach requested assistance on her behalf to play competitive soccer including registration, uniform, tournament fees. We gave \$299.

Krystal Roybal—is a single mother, her son is due for open heart surgery. She has FMLA leave, but not with pay. We gave her \$250 to help with bills in her time off.

**Mariah Calderon**—was given the opportunity to play on triple-crown USA all-star softball team, but needs help with trip costs. We gave her \$250. **Marissa Baumgardner**—is a student at St. Pius, was offered a chance to go on a pilgrimage to NY with Franciscan Friars of the Renewal, to assist with the rebuilding at ground zero. Her family is unable to afford the trip; we gave her \$250 towar the trip.
